# A Few Thoughts on Heaven Is For Real

Published in 2010, Heaven Is For Real is a best-selling book that records the story of Colton Burpo, a four-year-old boy who made it through an emergency appendectomy only to awaken with a detailed story of his trip to Heaven and back. The book has sold over 6 million copies and has been turned into a movie that recently released.

I am typically happy when anyone attempts to encourage faith, even I if am disturbed by their methods or motivations, so long as "Christ is proclaimed" (Phi. 1:15-18). I have been hesitant to even write about this book, but due to its immense popularity, I feel like a few comments are in order.

- 1. Experiences of Heaven In Scripture Are Extremely Rare. A very small number of people claim to have seen any part of Heaven in the Bible. Most are in the form of prophetic visions, such as Jacob (Gen. 28:12-13), Moses and the elders (Ex. 24:9-10), Micaiah (2 Chr. 18:18), Isaiah (Isaiah 6), Ezekiel (Ezekiel 1 & 10), Daniel (Dan. 7:9-14), and John (Revelation 4). Stephen saw Heaven in some sense before his death (Acts 7:55). Few of these examples are longer than a few verses; none are longer than a chapter.
- 2. The Only After-Death Experience In Scripture Is Marked By Confusion And Silence. Paul tells a story that is so convoluted that he cannot even say whether it is him in the story or if the person in the story was present bodily (2 Cor. 12:1-3). While the story sounds like an actual event that may have happened to Paul, Paul himself introduces it as "visions and revelations" (v. 1). Most importantly, the man in the vision did not produce any kind of extended account of what he saw, but rather Paul states: "he heard things that cannot be told, which man may not utter" (v. 4).
- 3. The Bible Strongly Opposes Inquiring of the Dead. The prophet Isaiah says, "And when they say to you, 'Inquire of the mediums and the necromancers who chirp and mutter,' should not a people inquire of their God? Should they inquire of the dead on behalf of the living?" (Isaiah 8:19) Jesus also frowns on the effectiveness of warnings from beyond the grave: "If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead" (Luke 16:31). While neither of

these stories are exactly parallel to our topic, they make me very leery of this entire approach to knowledge of Heaven or of any subject.

4. We Have Another Witness. Moses told the people that when they look for wisdom, they need not send someone to Heaven. They need only attend to God's Word (Deut. 30:11-14). Paul expands on that point and says that it is Jesus who has brought God's blessings down from Heaven, and it is Jesus who speaks to us from beyond the grave (Rom. 10:5-10). While I'm sure this four-year-old had no negative intention, I worry that our culture's obsession with his story and many like it detract from — rather than add to — the True Witness of Heaven.

### WE NEED YOUR HELP




Men and women - your help is needed TODAY at 2:00! If all goes as planned we will be moving out the current pews in the auditorium to make way for our new chairs.
