John 1:7 says he came to "bear witness of the Light, that all through Him might believe." And in 1:29, John said of Jesus: "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world." Bob Delay bore witness of the "Light" as well through his actions and words. An inspiration of what God can do through a person who has the desire to serve God above all else and has a sincere interest in the spiritual welfare of others. We can do the same, as ordinary people we can "Bear witness of the Light." We don't need any special talents. God has given us all we need. But we must possess a passion for helping others. We must love God and Christ with all our heart and then demonstrate our love through the lives we live. And then we must not hesitate but speak of the "The Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world"; for those who are lost, are truly lost without Christ!
