Proclaimed to Spirits in Prison

If you are reading the epistle of 1 Peter, the text below comes as kind of a shock:

For Christ also suffered once for sins, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit, in which he went and proclaimed to the spirits in prison, because they formerly did not obey, when God's patience waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was being prepared, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were brought safely through water. Baptism, which corresponds to this, now saves you, not as a removal of dirt from the body but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him. (1 Pet. 3:18-22)

It doesn't seem to relate to anything in the context, and it definitely has some strange information. Why is it there? What does it mean?

One possible understanding of this is to remember that the first century readers knew something that we have worked very hard to forget — there is a hidden world beyond human knowledge. Our modern minds don't go in for such talk of angels, demons, or any other type of spirits, but the first century world certainly did. The Gospels and the book of Acts are full of references to all sorts of these beings. Paul emphatically states, "we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places" (Ephesians 6:12). While we might wish to remain skeptical, the invisible powers are not only real, but at war with Christ's people.

It is entirely possible that Peter is pointing to this fact in his statement that Jesus has been "proclaimed to the spirits in prison." This proclamation was not made with the intent of saving the spirits or to offer redemption, but simply to declare a fact to the enemies of God and man. Notice has been served to the malevolent powers of the unseen world — Jesus is Lord and victorious overall!

How does this relate to Peter's point? The suffering Christians of the first century needed to know that their baptism (v. 21) identified them with the risen Christ, "who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers having been subjected to him" (v. 22). Jesus' victory over powers we cannot see is declared through a baptism which we can see. As the waters of Noah's flood rescued him from a wicked world, baptism lifts the people of God above the carnage created in this world by the forces of sin and evil. The suffering Christ is now the victorious Christ, just as his suffering people can be victorious with him in baptism.

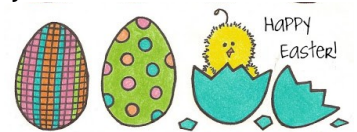
