Recently I came across a sermon outline titled “The Greatest Need.” The sermon asks the question: “What is man’s greatest need?” It then answers the question by saying: that though man has many needs such as peace, food for those who are starving, loving families, etc. The greatest need of man is Evangelism – spread of the gospel. Why is this need so great and especially right now can be answered very simply: Billions are dying lost in sin, without Jesus they will die in their sin. (Rom 3:23, John 8:24) And of course this means that many close to home Will Perish. Relatives, friends and neighbors will all perish unless we realize their greatest need and take it to heart. The sermon then goes on to ask “why is this need not being met?” and then gave several reasons including Lack of Courage, Lack of Knowing what to say, and Lack of Faith. But there were two reasons that made me stop and think. The first was Lack of Concern – am I concerned that the Lord’s cause is not being met for as Christ said, “*For the Son of Man came to seek and save that which was lost.*” (Luke 19:10) Yes, I’m concerned about some - those who I am close to. But for others, people I don’t know but could come to know if I made the effort, I found my concern wanting. And I had to stop and ask myself, why I am not doing more to *seek out the lost as Jesus did*. And I vowed right then to make more effort to get to know the lost that I come in contact with. Not just know them by name, but come to really know them as a person.

The second reason that caught my attention was Lack of Focus, for I fear that this is the reason that affects far too many Christians. For we are too distracted by the things of this world: sports, entertainment, recreation, our children’s activities and so on. We are often so caught up in our own little world that we set aside doing the Lord’s work. Let me suggest two things that we can do to keep our focus. First, we should all strive to put the Lord first in our lives, for as Jesus said, “seek first the Kingdom of God, and all these things will be added unto you.” (Mt. 6:33)

Then Second, view our activities as an opportunity to be the “Salt of the Earth.” For salt to be effective it must mix with food – likewise we need to be mixed with people; not just associated with other Christians but associate with the Lost of this world. For in this way we can have the greatest impact for the Lord’s cause. Few, if any are going to come to us seeking to know God. But if “We let our light shine” before others, I believe we can be a more effective witness for the Lord and some will be inspired to come to us seeking to know more about Christ. For this world has so many that are hurting: hurting for the Love of God, hurting for lack of His forgiveness and hurting for lack of purpose to life.
