It's Easier to Judge Ewe

Once a wise king was asked to judge in a difficult matter.

There were two men in a certain city, the one rich and the other poor. The rich man had very many flocks and herds, but the poor man had nothing but one little ewe lamb, which he had bought. And he brought it up, and it grew up with him and with his children. It used to eat of the man's own food and drink from his cup and lie in his arms, and it was like a daughter to the poor man. Now there came a traveler to the rich man, and he was unwilling to take one of his own flock or herd to prepare for the guest who had come to him, but he took the poor man's lamb, slaughtered it, and prepared it for the man who had come to him.

The king who heard this story was very angry and declared, “As the LORD lives, the man who has done this deserves to die, and he shall restore the lamb fourfold, because he did this thing, and because he had no pity” (2 Samuel 12:5-6).

The tragic irony of this story is that the king's name was David, and only recently he had done something far more sinister than the rich man in the story. David had taken another man's wife and then had him murdered (2 Samuel 11).

David was able to see the minor evil in another person's life, but not the greater evil in his own. This is not a rare problem. Jesus warned, “Judge not, that you be not judged. For with the judgment you pronounce you will be judged, and with the measure you use it will be measured to you. Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ when there is the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye” (Matthew 7:1-5).

David eventually saw his own sin, with a little help from a friend (2 Samuel 12:7-15). He would go on to write on this occasion one of the greatest of all psalms of grief and contrition in Psalm 51. “Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin! For I know my transgressions, and my sin is ever before me” (Psalm 51:2-3).

When you find on your lips words of criticism for someone else, take a moment and look carefully at yourself. What evil abides in your life that needs to be washed? Are you criticizing others loudly in order to drown out the voice of your own conscience?

Have you been judging ewe, when ewe should have been judging you?
