Then Job answered the LORD and said: "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted. 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?' Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know. 'Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you make it known to me.' I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes" (Job 42:1-6).

We live in a culture that values knowledge highly. Getting an education is the same thing as preparing for success. Knowledge is power, or so we are told.

As a result, we deem ourselves fit judges of all things. We can turn our mind toward politics or economics or the work of others. We feel justified in criticizing all things because we know, deep down, that we know best. Our opinion matters.

What we forget, as did even patient Job, is that we know a lot less than we think. We have a tendency to decide that we know so much, we can even turn our critical eyes up toward Heaven and offer God some advice. God is not impressed. Job had done exactly this, and now he repents by confessing his ignorance. "I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know." The wisest a man may be is in the moment that he sees himself as a creation of dust and clay before his Creator.

But this is a minor sin, isn't it? No. The pride that comes with a too high assessment of our own knowledge is the root of many crimes against God. As such, God has stern words of warning for those of us who, unlike Job, have not yet found our repentance in the dust.

After the LORD had spoken these words to Job, the LORD said to Eliphaz the Temanite: "My anger burns against you and against your two friends, for you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has. Now therefore take seven bulls and seven rams and go to my servant Job and offer up a burnt offering for yourselves. And my servant Job shall pray for you, for I will accept his prayer not to deal with you according to your folly. For you have not spoken of me what is right, as my servant Job has" (Job 42:7-8).

Eliphaz had spoken a lot about God, but they had been words spoken to prove himself right and Job wrong, rather than to bring God glory. Do you turn to God's wisdom because you happen to agree with him today, or do you recognize his wisdom as far surpassing your own? Do you know that it is not in man that walks to direct his own steps? Do you turn from Creator to creature and judge with the same critical eye? Do you forget that each human is "the servant of another" (Romans 14:4)?


Elders and Deacons meeting Sunday, Nov 8th at 3:00.
