The Cares of the World

In one of his books, Michael Shanks describes his enthusiasm for teaching others the gospel, and how he was using the old Jule Miller Film Strips. The associate minister at the church where he attended had checked out a projector to him and within a month he had burned out the bulb in the projector. Michael, startled at the price of the bulb, asked how the church could afford them. He was even more startled to find out that himself and the associate minister were the only ones in the congregation of about 900 members using the film strips. Michael wanted to know why others were not doing more to evangelize. The young minister pulled out his Bible and turned to the Parable of the Sower (Mark 4:13-20). “But the cares of the world and the deceitfulness of riches and the desires for other things enter in and choke the word, and it proves unfruitful” (v. 19). This is the challenge of the church today. Too many Christians are too involved in the cares of the world to be effective for Christ.

Let there be no misunderstanding, no doubt we must provide for our families. No man or woman should neglect his children for the work of the church, and it doesn't seem to get any easier to gain time as we get older. So what's the answer – When is there time to share the gospel? The more I think about that question, the more I think it should be reversed – When is there **not** a time to share the gospel? As we spend time with our children, should we not use some of that time to teach Biblical Principles? As we take our children to their various activities, is there no time for visiting with the parents of other children; letting our light shine by discussing the wonderful youth program at the church and how good the teachers of our youth are, or expressing the contentment only found in Christ. And at work, during break time or at lunch hour, instead of talking about the past football game or the last fishing trip, could we not discuss the sermon we heard the previous Sunday? Recently, Ben had an excellent lesson on how people are always trying to get to a time when there is no trouble, yet never seem to get there. Instead we should see the present time as our best days and make the most of them. Could we not share lessons like that with our friends at work?

So friends, let us not be guilt of making the excuse that “I have no timeshare the gospel.” Let us not allow the cares of the world to cause us to be unfruitful. Instead, see every day as an opportunity to speak and be thinking how we can create interest in God, the church, and the love of Jesus Christ.
