## NEWS & NOTES FROM BEN

Easter is almost here! As a congregation, we have never formally practiced a liturgical celebration of Easter, but of course many, many families choose to share this special occasion together with us. In a world gone mad and increasingly godless, I am thrilled to see folk remembering the Resurrection of Jesus. When I see people honoring Christ for any reason, it gives me hope that not all is lost in our world. As Paul stated, “Only that in every way, whether in pretense or in truth, Christ is proclaimed, and in that I rejoice” (Philippians 1:18).

I think it is wonderful that our civilization still can be bothered to remember the Resurrection of Jesus at all. We have national holidays for major events in our history, like Independence Day and Veteran’s Day. We have holidays to celebrate love, like Valentines and Anniversaries. We even have days to celebrate ourselves—Happy Birthday! Our culture chooses to honor veterans, graduates, presidents, Martin Luther King, Jr., Christopher Columbus, and every other person we can think of. It is only fitting that Jesus be on the list. He is after all the most important person who ever lived, and he “was declared to be the Son of God in power according to the Spirit of holiness by his resurrection from the dead” (Romans 1:4).

This year at Easter, I’ll be preaching on the Resurrection account found in the Gospel of Luke. There we read that at first, the disciples thought the Resurrection of Jesus might only be “an idle tale” (Luke 24:11). I think the challenge to us today is to hear the Resurrection as the life-altering story it is. It is no bedtime story or fairytale. It is the very real story of God rescuing the world and defeating death. It is the story of how Jesus became the Lord of your life.

Following Easter, I’m excited to begin a sermon series on the book of Acts. Since we are already covering the book of Acts in our two adult classes, I won’t be going verse by verse or anything like that. I’ll be taking a topical look at “The Why of Christianity.” What does Acts tell us about Christianity? Why do Christians live and believe as they do? My hope is that the story of the Resurrection so commonly remembered at Easter propels us into the story of the church which followed in the book of Acts.

So open up those New Testaments and get ready to be reminded of why we are here, why we are Christians, and what it all means! Invite a friend!
