LETTER FROM AN ELDER

Trying Times—Devon Prescott

Love and peace be with you in the name of Jesus Christ.

My grandparents got married in 1928 in the middle of the sand hills of central Nebraska. This was a stark place at a stark time. The great depression and a massive drought combined to starve out many of their neighbors. But my people survived to multiply as did yours, or you would not be reading this today.

The earth is facing a calamity with this COVID-19 virus that will change our lives in the days ahead. However, I want to remind you all that we are here by virtue of our ancestors surviving pandemics, natural disasters, droughts, wars, genocides, and many other difficulties.

In the same way, our spiritual ancestors in the church have endured persecution, denial, threats, attempted eradication by governments and false religions. We all hail from hearty stock both physically and spiritually.

The Center for Disease Control is requesting that we stop gathering in groups to limit the exponential growth of the COVID-19 virus. The idea is that the virus will adapt over time so that is does not kill its host (killing the host is bad form for a successful virus). Further if we can get to the warm part of the Summer when virus cells are killed faster by the warm temperatures and direct UV sunlight the spread will naturally calm down. So the combination of warm weather and maturation of the virus points to brighter future ahead.

We have a special responsibility to our Lord to look upon our fellow citizens and sojourners as God's own children. I pray that God will allow us to rally to the occasion and that our hands will find ready work helping one another and those we find in our midst in the days ahead. Further, I pray that though our bodies may be distant our hearts will be united.
