MESSAGE FROM THE ELDERS

For the Time Being, Mask Wearing is No Longer Optional

With the threat of COVID-19 growing everyday throughout our area, the elders have decided to take additional precautions. **Masks must now be worn at all times during our worship services and Bible class activities.** The only exceptions will be for members to remove their masks long enough to take communion & for worship leaders to remove their masks, if they choose, while in the pulpit at the front of the auditorium. The elders however, believe parents of young children should be allowed to use common sense in this regard. With the intention being that children who are old enough to understand how to wear a mask, should be expected to wear one. During this pandemic, the health and well-being of all who choose to worship in our building is very important to us. The elders are regularly monitoring state epidemiology reports about the spread and severity of the virus in our area. They regret the progression of this virus has forced such stringent requirements to be necessary and are praying the risk levels will soon decline to the point where it is safe once again to relax this mask requirement. Masks will continue to be available in the lobby for visitors or members who forget to bring one. And we remind everyone that our services are being broadcast live on our congregational YouTube channel. We encourage our members who are most at risk or displaying symptoms of the virus to please remain at home & participate virtually. The elders would like to thank each of you for your understanding and patience. 

Greetings, dear partners! UBI is now on winter break. Most of the students have returned home and are beginning their winter ministry practice in their home congregations. Earlier this year the Glenpool congregation graciously donated \$3,551 to the work in Cambodia. Some of that money was used earlier this month to help distribute 14 tons of rice to remote villages impacted by unseasonable flooding. Without this relief some might have starved. The rest of the money is going to be used to double the number of leadership seminars in 2021, from two seminars to four. Each leadership seminar hosts about 100 house church leaders on the CCM campus for a long weekend of Bible study. These house church leaders are capable and committed people who are in need of additional instruction, much like Apollos in Acts 18. So, just as Priscilla and Aquila lovingly explained the way of God more accurately to Apollos, CCM seeks to expand and to clarify the house church leaders' knowledge of Scripture. And, since each of these house church leaders hosts congregations averaging between one and two dozen people, each seminar has the ability to impact the faith of 1,200 to 2,400 souls. David Gray is one of four instructors who will take part in these seminars. Please pray for the success of these seminars.
